Arts and Culture: Because we believe that the arts uplift and illuminate the lives of communities, we provide support to the American Film Institute and National Foundation for Advancement in the Arts; help for local performing organizations like the Goodman Theatre and Lyric Opera in Chicago; American Airlines Theatre and Roundabout Theatre in New York; and aid to hundreds of smaller organizations from youth ballet troupes to up-and-coming art museums to literary festivals.

Education: Our company was built upon an educated and capable workforce, and we clearly understand that same need in our home country and all the nations we serve. In Japan, our employees help high-school-age students to learn and understand business concepts and practices through Junior Achievement. In the United States, our support is wide-ranging, from after-school enrichment programs in public schools to assistance for colleges and universities. We're especially proud of our long support of the United Negro College Fund; we provide financial support to their scholarship programs, and we partner with UNCF for recruitment to ensure American Airlines continues to employ a workforce that reflects the diversity of our customer base. Numerous universities also receive our support for various programs specializing in aviation, communications and business administration.

Health and Human Services: American Airlines partners with a number of organizations with large missions, including the Cystic Fibrosis Foundation and Susan G. Komen for the Cure[®], American has helped raise more the \$30 million for these two foundations through our annual AA Celebrity Ski and Celebrity Golf & Tennis events. Much of our focus in health and human services is on children, including support for the Something mAAgic Foundation[®], which

supports the missions of Give Kids the World® and other children's organizations to create magical memories for children with life-threatening medical conditions. And for many years we have supported an employee-developed program called Miles For Kids In Need®, which uses AAdvantage miles donated by AAdvantage members, our employees and our company to help provide thousands of trips annually for children as well as organizations with needs related to medical, educational and social concerns and/or causes that heighten public awareness of children's issues.
