EXHIBITION DESCRIPTION

Tutankhamun: The Golden King and the Great Pharaohs is a once-in-a-lifetime exhibition of more than 100 treasures from ancient Egyptian sites, and objects from the tomb of King Tut. This exhibition will debut and have its sole Rocky Mountain appearance at the Denver Art Museum (DAM) June 29, 2010 through January 9, 2011. The exhibition is organized by the National Geographic Society, Arts and Exhibitions International and AEG Exhibitions, with cooperation from the Egyptian Supreme Council of Antiquities. A portion of the proceeds from the tour will go toward antiquities preservation and conservation efforts in Egypt, including the construction of a new grand museum in Cairo.
