### **Variations on a Rectangle with DJ Stout**

As a publication designer for the past 30 years, DJ Stout knows a thing or two about what makes a successful magazine cover. In the 1990s he was the celebrated art director of *Texas Monthly*, where he captured the hearts and souls of Texans, and the admiration of designers and art directors everywhere. He loves the challenge of communicating big ideas in the simplest possible way. Last year, his mono-graph, *Variations on a Rectangle*, was published. It covers his 30+ year career and features more than 250 projects.

Stout, who was the award-winning art director of *Texas Monthly* magazine for 13 years and a Pentagram partner since 2000, will show examples from his new book and relay how he learned to think inside the box.
